Biographical Note	Asa Turner was a Reverend of the Congregationalists, a graduate of Yale, and a key figure in Quincy's anti-slavery movement. She helped to send escaping slaves to Quincy from her Congregational Church. While a professor at Illinois College, J. B. Turner assisted in at least 1 rescue of slaves looking for freedom <u>Charles Turner</u> fought in the Civil War and is now buried in Lakeside Cemetery. He enlisted in the Union in 1862 and helped to organize the 108th Regiment Illinois volunteers.
Scope & Content	The Turner Family collection includes letters from members of the family from the years 1850-1898.
