A BRIEF SKETCH
OF
MATTERS AND THINGS PERTAINING
TO THE
CITY OF GALESBURG.

This work is distinctively a home enterprise, and, for this reason, a certain degree of local pride is neither unbecoming, nor matter for surprise. As in a well-ordered family, each is conscious of, and yet purposely blind to, the shortcomings of the others; so, as citizens, while well aware of what is lacking to our material advancement, yet all are united in extolling the advantages—and they are many—which our city possesses over many of its more ambitious sisters.

The history of Galesburg begins with the purchase in 1835-6 of a large tract of land by an earnest band of Christian men and women, with the settled purpose of establishing in what was then the wild Western country, an educational centre, whence God-fearing men and women might be trained and sent out to spread still farther, in ever-widening circles, the influence of a distinctively Christian education.

Naturally, a society organized on such a basis drew to itself the better elements of Eastern emigration, and thus, by slow and healthful growth, a village of respectable size was formed, of which the College—Old Knox, as she is familiarly termed—was the acknowledged center and paramount influence; and, while the largely accelerated growth following upon the introduction and extension of railways, and the establishment of manufactories and diverse industries, has in great measure subordinated the dominant power, the old leaven is still working in the community.

Galesburg was incorporated as a city in the year 1857, since which time its growth in population, while not phenomenal, has been steady. In other respects than numerical increase, the Galesburg of to-day may safely challenge comparison with any city. Her extent of territory, nearly double that of the Capital City of Illinois, her well-lighted streets, whose grading and thorough drainage and graveling are fast overcoming the proverbial locomotive difficulties of *Illinois mud*; her excellent water-supply system for fire purposes; the general healthfulness of the city, despite climatic influences

incident to the latitude, as evidenced by the low death rate—the deaths for 1882 having been but 168; the high moral tone of the city, as shown in the marked absence of the more serious forms of crime; and last, and most important of all, the unequal educational advantages here offered, are constantly drawing hither families seeking a home where children may be trained up to lives of usefulness and honor.

PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

It is a truism that the child is father to the man, and it would seem that no apology is required for giving the place of honor to that which fits the child to take his place as a law-making and law-abiding citizen. Educationally, Galesburg is a highly favored city. The Public School System is under the control of a Board of Education elected by the citizens. The various wards are provided with handsome and commodious buildings of brick and stone, with modern appliances for heating and ventilation, supplemented with a Central High School Building which is one of the architectural ornaments of the city, and a monument of the liberality of the citizens in educational matters. The various Boards of Education, since the first organization in 1859, have, without exception, worked harmoniously together for the common good, and the result is seen to-day in the excellence of the school system, and the recognized standing of the pupils who have passed through the course of study prescribed. The enrollment of pupils on January 1st, 1883, numbered 1,700, cared for by 35 teachers.

KNOX COLLEGE

whose early history is identical with that of the city, and whose advancement has kept pace with her development, offers the advantages of a full collegiate course, embracing Ancient and Modern Languages, the Higher Mathematics, Natural and Mental Philosophy and general Literature. Such as desire may pursue a shorter course, designated as Scientific, and excluding the Ancient Languages.

THE FEMALE SEMINARY offers the advantages of a boarding school of the highest order for young ladies, in connection with or distinct from the College Course.

THE ACADEMIC DEPARTMENT prepares students of both sexes for admission to the College or Seminary.

LOMBARD UNIVERSITY

under the control of the Universalist denomination, is avowedly non-sectarian in its ends and aims. It offers to students of either sex opportunity for a thorough course of instruction, the various departments including a Preparatory Department, a Literary Course, a Scientific Course, and a full Collegiate Course. A Boarding Hall has recently been added, where students may receive good accommodations at the minimum of cost.

ST. JOSEPH'S ACADEMY

a Catholic educational institution, erected in 1879, is under the charge of the Sisters of Providence, and offers to members of that faith educational op-

opportunities of a high order. During the short time that the School has been in existence, it has made gratifying progress.

NEWSPAPERS.

THE DAILY AND WEEKLY REPUBLICAN-REGISTER is published by the Galesburg Printing Company, duly incorporated under State laws. It is Republican in politics, and well equipped in all departments.

THE PLAINDEALER is published weekly by the Plaindealer Printing Company, is Independent Republican, and claims the right to that freedom of speech which the name implies, criticising men and measures without fear or favor. Mr. Henry Emrich, the Business Manager, is an old printer of recognized ability, and Mr. Iram Biggs, in the Job Department, asks no odds of anybody.

THE PRESS AND PEOPLE (weekly), which has recently come under the control of Mr. Gersh Martin, is now an avowedly Democratic organ, and as the only exponent of that party in Knox County, should receive, as from its ability it deserves, the hearty support of all good Democrats. We would not be surprised if Gersh already had his eye on the Post Office for '85.

RAILROADS.

Railroads are important factors in the growth and prosperity of a city, and in proportion as railway facilities are ample and competition free, will be the advancement and material progress of a community. It is to be deplored that, with all her other advantages, Galesburg is yet practically restricted to but one outlet for her productions, and manufacturers are consequently at a disadvantage in competition with others better situated in this respect. It is a matter of congratulation, however, that there is no danger of the railroad corporation emulating the old woman in the fable of the Goose and the Golden Egg.

CHICAGO, BURLINGTON & QUINCY RAILROAD.—Depot and Freight Office on Depot and Prairie streets. Connects by the main line and branches intersecting here with Chicago and all important points East, West, North and South. The road is one of the best managed and equipped in the United States, and ranks second to none. The shops connected with the road employ a large number of hands and disburse every pay-day a great amount of money. The railroad trade is, consequently, a very important element of business prosperity.

The C. B. & Q. STOCK YARDS have been added to from time to time, until their present capacity is over two hundred cars, and there is still demand for more room.

The PASSENGER DEPOT at present is an old wooden structure, entirely inadequate to the purposes of a Depot, and unworthy alike of the Company and the City. There is good ground for the belief that the present season will witness the erection of a creditable building, so located and arranged that passengers may take trains or reach terra-firma without the imminent danger to life or limb now incurred.

FULTON COUNTY NARROW GAUGE RAILROAD.—Running from Galesburg to Havana, Ill., and completed in 1882. It has opened to

our trade a prosperous farming country, and given access to coal and wood supplies of excellent quality. The importance of this was shown during the past winter, when fuel was held at a moderate price, and the usual famine prices, consequent upon bad country roads, entirely kept in check. There is some talk of a northward extension of this road at an early day, and all will join in wishing success to a deserving enterprise.

PUBLIC LIBRARY.

Among the public institutions of Galesburg, the Public Library holds a prominent place. The library was opened in 1873, The Young Men's Literary and Library Association, which was organized some five or six years previously by a number of public spirited citizens, at that time generously turning over its accumulation of books, and merging its existence in the Public Library. This institution, now in its tenth year, is supported by a small tax, and is very largely patronized by those for whose benefit it was established. The library contains close upon 12,000 volumes; and the reading-room, open to the public daily, contains the leading newspapers and magazines of all parts of the country.

COVENANT MUTUAL BENEFIT ASSOCIATION.

This association, designed to supply the benefits of co-operative life insurance to Odd Fellows and their families, has grown to be one of the institutions of our city and State. Organized but six years since, by a mere handful of Odd Fellows resident here, it had attained in January, 1883, to a membership of 10,469, and has paid to families of deceased members nearly one half a million dollars. This institution, whose grand success is largely due to its efficient Secretary, Col. E. F. Phelps, is now the leading society of the kind in the United States, and is still moving steadily forward.

MECHANICS' HOMESTEAD AND LOAN ASSOCIATION.

Although comparatively a new incorporation, the M. H. & L. A. has already grown to be an unquestionable success, and opens to the mechanic and laboring man an easy plan of acquiring a home for his family through the investment of his monthly savings. The object of the Association is two-fold. It affords a ready means for the profitable and secure investment of small savings, and enables its members to obtain loans for the purpose of procuring homes, and virtually making payment by monthly payments, about equal to an ordinary rental. In this Association a person may invest his savings every month at a profitable rate of interest, and with first-class security; and obtain money on ten years' time and cancel the loan by monthly payments and dividends. The capital stock is \$500,000, divided into 600 shares of \$100 each, payable in monthly installments of fifty cents per share. The profit arising from the monthly investment of the stock installments and the earnings are applied to the payment of the capital stock. By the provisions of the State law the Secretary is the only officer who can receive compensation for his services. Aside from this and the small running expenses, the profits go directly back among the members on a purely mutual basis. As the funds, as soon as received, are loaned on ample real estate se-

curity, and as the Secretary and Treasurer are required to give approved bonds, there is no reasonable chance of loss. Each stockholder is entitled to a loan of \$100 on each share of stock he or she may hold. The receipts of each month, if not less than one hundred dollars, are offered for loan at each monthly meeting; and the shareholder offering the highest premium shall have prior right to the loan. The borrower pays 8 per cent interest upon each one hundred dollars borrowed. The officers of the Association are the following: Geo. Churchill, President; Lake W. Sanborn, Secretary; W. W. Washburn, Treasurer.

POST OFFICE.

A sketch of the institutions of the city should, as a matter of course, include the Post Office. In these modern days a city without proper mail facilities would be indeed an anomaly. The business of the Galesburg Post Office has grown to great proportions, each quarterly statement showing marked increase of revenue to the department, after all running expenses are paid. Croakers, who gloomily foretell the decadence of our College City, may explain away this, but the fact remains. The good old lady who in the early days of Galesburg, kept Post Office in a corner of her kitchen cupboard, wiping the suds of the family work from her hands, mayhap reluctantly stopping a moment from working down the dough for the oven, to attend to the wants of a chance caller for mail, perchance, luckless wight! only to find a charge of twenty-five cents postage on a letter from home—a sum that, in those days, only the well-to-do settler could command—would hardly recognize her bantling were she to return to the old scenes. Times have indeed changed, and nowhere is the change more perceptible than in the Post Office of to-day, with its almost perfect system, and multiplied conveniences. Candor compels the admission that the Galesburg Post Office, is hardly a thing of beauty, externally, but of the Postmaster, Colonel Carr, who has so long and acceptably filled that important position, it is sufficient commendation to say that his record with the department, during his long term of office, is absolutely without blemish, and his management of the office such as to have given no reasonable ground for complaint on the part of its patrons. The establishment of Free Delivery on April 1st, 1883, inaugurated a new departure in postal affairs, and the system, as it is rapidly being perfected and extended over the entire city, bids fair to merit and receive unbounded approval.

CIRCUIT COURT.

This is the Tenth Judicial Circuit of Illinois, whose Judges are Hon. Arthur A. Smith, of Galesburg; Hon. John J. Glenn, of Monmouth; and Hon. Geo. W. Pleasants, of Rock Island. The terms are held the first Monday in February and June, and the third Monday in October. John J. Tunnell, State's Attorney; Circuit Clerk and Recorder, George L. Hanna-man; James B. Boggs, Master in Chancery. Circuit Court meets in Opera House, South side Public Square.

NOTE—For the purpose of numbering, the city is divided north and south by Main street, and east and west by Broad street. All streets running north and south take the prefix *north*, north of Main street, but have no prefix south of Main street. In the same manner all streets intersecting Broad street take the prefix *west*, west of Broad, but have no prefix east of that street. The numbering of the streets begins at the base line on Broad or Main street and each block is assigned 100 numbers, the second block running from 100 to 200, the third to 300, and so on. By this plan, the number of a house being given, it is easy to calculate its distance from the dividing line in either direction.
