The Publishers take pleasure in presenting Vol. IV. of COLVILLE'S BIENNIAL DIRECTORY OF THE CITY OF GALESBURG to its patrons. In the preparation of this volume every effort has been made to maintain the reputation of previous issues for accuracy and completeness, and to make it in all respects a credit to our College City, its enterprising and public-spirited Business Men, and the Publishers.

The NAME DIRECTORY contains 6,216 individual names, being a net increase over the list of two years ago of 662 names, although that list was very considerably increased by the floating force of laborers engaged in the construction of the Santa Fe R. R. Our census of 1887 gave a population of 14,831; on the most moderate estimate this increase of 662 names represents fully twice that number of inhabitants, giving us a present population of 16,155, with the assurance of a steady and continual future growth.

The Publishers invite attention to their new and enlarged MAP OF GALESBURG, giving the whole extent of the City's territory, and Ward boundaries, with all changes and additions to date accurately shown. A HOUSE DIRECTORY is a new feature which it is hoped will prove serviceable to the patrons of the DIRECTORY.

As the DIRECTORY is used as a Reference Book in the leading Cities of the country, and is consulted by thousands desiring information concerning our City and its Business Interests, the Publishers congratulate the citizens of Galesburg that they are represented by a work in every way worthy of the City.

A brief Sketch of the early history and growth of Galesburg will be found in the HISTORICAL DEPARTMENT. Under the head of EDITORIAL MENTION the leading Manufacturing Industries and Business Houses are appropriately noticed.

To the enterprising Business Men of Galesburg, with grateful acknowledgment of their continued confidence and generous support, this volume is respectfully dedicated.

THE CITY OF GALESBURG.

Galesburg, the county seat of Knox County, Illinois, one of the wealthiest and most prosperous counties of the great Prairie State, is beautifully situated in the old Military Tract, upon the crown of the watershed between the Illinois and Mississippi rivers, surrounded by the most fertile farming country in the West, underlaid with inexhaustible deposits of coal and clay of superior quality for the manufacture of paving brick, tile and pottery ware.

In this city are found many advantages which commend it to all in search of a desirable location. It is a remarkably healthful city. The death rate in the past ten years has varied from 10.46 to 12.7 in the thousand, proving it more healthful than the boasted health resorts of the United States. The people are law-abiding and orderly; serious crimes are of rare occurrence, and it is many years since a murder has disgraced our annals. The city is free from debt, and taxes are not burdensome; the streets are lighted by electricity; waterworks, owned and operated by the city, are in partial operation and will soon be widely extended; the telephone puts us on speaking terms with neighboring towns, and street cars make outlying suburbs easily accessible; our schools and colleges have given Galesburg a national reputation as the great educational center of the Northwest; situated upon the main line of two of the most important railway systems of the United States, our railroad facilities are unsurpassed, and nothing is lacking that tends to material progress.

In these days towns are born of a cleverly worked-up "boom," engineered by a syndicate of none too scrupulous capitalists, solely intent on money getting. Galesburg is the child of a Christian idea, conceived in the brain of an earnest Christian, full of love for his fellow-men. Such a man was the Rev. George W. Gale, the founder of Galesburg. Some-

thing more than half a century ago the Valley of the Mississippi, now teeming with its millions of population, was just beginning to attract settlers to its fertile prairies. Mr. Gale, long imbued with the idea of training young men for the ministry, saw the growing need in the west of an educational institution with this as its central aim and end, and labored to infect others with his zeal, to such purpose that a colony was soon organized, money pledged, and measures set on foot to select a suitable locality, purchase lands and lay out a town.

After some disappointments and delays, the committee intrusted with this important work succeeded in securing a large tract of fertile, rolling prairie land, in the center of which the city of Galesburg now stands. In the early spring of 1836 the colonists turned their backs on the comforts and privileges of Eastern civilization and set their faces westward, arriving at Log City June 2d. During the summer fresh accessions continued to arrive, until a total of about 175, from curly pate to grizzled poll, had gathered there, upon the borders of the promised land. The winter of 1836-7—the elements were merciful and Dakota blizzards were as yet unborn—was passed in rude cabins and temporary make shifts at Log City. The spring and summer of 1837 saw the colonists permanently located in their new village, which was named Galesburg, in honor of its founder.

Thus the village of Galesburg was fairly started in life, with a population of 232, all told. As was to be expected, the first care of the new community was to provide religious privileges, and the old First Church of Christ, whose history is interwoven with that of the village and college, was organized in February of the same year. In March, 1837, a charter for the College was obtained, and in the following year the Academy building was erected.

In 1841 the population had grown to 500 and the town of Galesburg was organized, securing a voting precinct and a postoffice of its own, and cutting loose from its elder sister, Knoxville. The college was already well under way, the fertile acres around the little town smiled with their golden harvests, and the "country-store," with its heterogeneous stock, exchanged commodities with its patrons. Money, good, honest coin of

the realm, was painfully scarce, and corn, pork and eggs were the circulating medium. In 1846 the population touched 800, and all were reasonably prosperous and contented, an occasional intellectual sparring match over college matters furnishing all needful diversion.

With our railroads radiating in every direction, giving us choice of markets for the disposal of our products, it is difficult to realize that at this time Peoria, fifty miles distant, was the nearest point where the farm products could be sold and supplies obtained. The trip by wagon over rough country roads was tedious at the best, and it depended entirely on the weather whether the journey should be of two days' or two weeks' duration. Illinois mud was then, as now, fearfully and wonderfully deep and sticky!

In the winter of 1854-5 the railroad now known as the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad reached here, placing Galesburg in direct communication with Chicago. It is matter of history that an important part in the organization, location and construction of this road was taken by some of the leading citizens, who realized that no effort or sacrifice was too great to secure it for Galesburg. All honor to these old citizens; they have mostly gone to their reward, rest their souls! May our city never lack their like in time of need. It was in recognition of their valuable personal effort and financial aid that the extensive machine and repair shops of the road were built here. How great a factor this has been in the subsequent prosperity of the city is easily inferred when we consider that a full third of our population looks to the pay-rolls of the "Q" for the wherewithal to keep the pot boiling. The first train to enter Galesburg was pulled by a locomotive named the "Reindeer," and the date of its entry Dec. 7, 1854. Small wonder if with the general rejoicing over the advent of "the tie that binds" may have mingled somewhat of apprehension as to possible consequences.

From this time forth the growth of Galesburg proceeded rapidly. The railroad prospered, its repair and machine shops were continually enlarged, and furnished employment to an ever-increasing army of workers. Business of all kinds felt the impetus and manufacturing industries sprang up and grew to large proportions. The year 1856

opened with a population of nearly 4,000, and was marked by great activity and progress. In 1857 a city charter was obtained, and the City of Galesburg took her place among the cities of Illinois. In the years succeeding events moved at quickstep: the city boundaries were enlarged; the schools reorganized under a special charter, the streets lighted with gas, and a general marked advance made in all directions. Lack of space forbids mention of much that well deserves notice here, but must be passed over. In the trying times of the civil war Galesburg was not found wanting, but gave freely of her sons and means to sustain the government and cheer the boys in the field. In these "piping times of peace" she is no less ready to aid and foster every good enterprise. In the great movement of population to the boundless plains and valleys of the far west, she has sent forth her sons and daughters, nurtured under the refining influences and armed with the panoply of a Christian education, to the peopling and upbuilding of countless new communities. Who can estimate the value or measure the extent of the good thus wrought?

The gratifying signs of vigorous and healthful growth, which it was our pleasing task to chronicle in our Directory of two years ago, still show on every hand, and give evidence that it is no spasmodic "boom" to be followed by a season of stagnation and depression, but a genuine progress with a backbone to it. Values are rising surely and continually; transfers of real estate are numerous, and mostly for building purposes, not speculative. As the city expands, outlying lands have been platted, streets opened and graded, and the lots rapidly sold. Where two years ago was open prairie are now streets with rows of tasty houses and neatly kept grounds. The corporate limits contain no less than 150 miles of streets, lighted by electricity, graded and well drained, provided with good sidewalks, and made beautiful by shade trees. The area of permanent street improvement is being yearly extended, and it will not be many years before brick pavement and walks will have made muddy roads a miry memory only.

Galesburg is emphatically a city of homes. Even the humble day laborer, as a rule, owns the roof that shelters his little flock, and herein,

we opine, lies the secret of the absence of lawlessness, which is a notable characteristic of our city. During the past two years, not less than 250 new dwellings have been built, and at the present writing the sound of the hammer and saw makes melodious music in every quarter. New business blocks are in course of erection, several of which bid fair to be architectural ornaments to the city. The new Opera House, remodeled from old Caledonia Hall at a cost of \$11,000, is a gem in its way. The Santa Fe Passenger Depot, recently opened to the public, is an attractive structure of red sandstone, of irregular gothic design, costing about \$40,000, and a decided improvement upon the tumble-down sheds that formerly stood there. A new High School building, erected at a cost of \$25,000, occupies the corner of Broad street, facing Knox Seminary, and the contract has just been let for the erection of another ward school building, to cost about \$16,000.

The water supply question is still occupying a prominent place in the deliberations of the city Fathers, and its correct solution apparently discounts in difficulty the pigs-in-clover puzzle. There is no disposition to repeat the costly experience of the Shelton fiasco, but rather a grim determination to accumulate a store of experimental knowledge, that shall at least make clear the path for future generations. Investigation thus far seems to point to the locality in the valley of Cedar Fork, known as Crystal Springs, as the converging point of a seemingly inexhaustible supply of pure, wholesome water. Analysis by competent chemists shows a total absence of local contamination, and should allay any fears on that score. From a large well sunk into the water-bearing stratum of sand—nearly sixty feet in thickness at this point, a system of pipes has been laid, affording thorough protection from fire to the business portion, and supplying a considerable number of private consumers. It is the intention, when the long-drawn-out litigation with Shelton's victims shall have been decided, to erect a waterworks plant, supplying the entire city, and owned and controlled by the city. Heaven speed the day!

In point of healthfulness Galesburg maintains her exceptionally good record. The death rate in cities throughout the United States varies

from 12.79 to 25.38 in the thousand, the average being 19.08. The death rate of Galesburg in recent years has varied from 12.05 to the thousand in 1886, to 11.09 in 1888. These figures bear out the assertion that ours is indeed a goodly city to live in.

Like other cities Galesburg has a police force and a jail, both first-class, though small, and undoubtedly useful for the arrest and detention of visiting criminals. Our schools and churches, reinforced by the prevailing healthy moral sentiment—a heritage from the founders of the town—are a power for good in the repression of lawlessness more potent than policemen's clubs. The arrests are mostly for drunkenness and petty misdemeanors, serious crime being rare, and murder for years unknown.

To all these peculiar advantages, moral, educational, social, and sanitary, is now added the crowning business advantage of railway shipping facilities unsurpassed by any inland city anywhere. By the completion of the Chicago, Santa Fe & California railroad, we are now upon the main line of two of the greatest railway systems of the United States, with branch lines running out from this point in every direction, making this the natural trade center of a large scope of territory. As a result an extensive jobbing trade is being rapidly built up, which is destined to attain to great proportions. Already movements are on foot looking to the location here of several Eastern manufactories whose market lies in the West. As time goes on, other industries, seeking for a favorable location, will not be slow to perceive the manifest advantages offered here. To all such let us each and all be ever ready to offer proper aid and fitting inducements, at the same time scanning very closely such as begin proceedings by passing round the hat.

EDUCATIONAL.

The schools and colleges of Galesburg rank deservedly high among the educational institutions of the country, and have been a potent influence in attracting a most desirable class of citizens. The title of "College City" is no misnomer when applied to Galesburg, and every good citizen is proud of the institutions which have made her what she is to-day. First among these institutions of learning stands

KNOX COLLEGE.

The sketch of the city already given includes the story of the founding of this institution, and to this we refer the reader curious for particulars. The college was founded in 1837 but was not fully organized until 1841. She sent out her first class of graduates in 1845. The early history of Knox College was a rather checkered one, with alternating periods of success and misfortune. For many years the college has enjoyed a high degree of prosperity, and its future prospects were never so bright. The standard of scholarship is high, the course of study broad, thorough, and comprehensive. Hon. Newton Bateman, widely known as an eminent educator, has been president since 1875. The college faculty is composed of able and scholarly professors, who have long and well filled their respective positions, and to whose zeal and learning much of the success and high standing of the institution is due.

In its various departments the college is fully equipped with all apparatus and appliances necessary to the proper presentment of instruction. An observatory has recently been erected and supplied with a fine six-inch lens telescope and other astronomical instruments. A building to serve as chapel and society hall will probably be built in the near future. The attendance during the past year has been larger than ever before.

In the collegiate department the classical course offers complete and thorough instruction. A scientific course, excluding Greek, is provided for those who desire. The standard of qualification for admittance to this course has been raised, much to the enhancement of the reputation of the school. A course of military training, under the charge of a regular army officer, specially detailed for the purpose, is open to all students who choose to avail themselves of it.

KNOX SEMINARY

is designed to furnish a liberal course of instruction to young ladies, the regular course of study occupying four years. The various college courses are open to the young ladies on an equal footing with the young men, and they enjoy all the advantages of the college libraries, cabinets,

and apparatus. Board and rooms for young ladies from abroad are provided in the seminary building.

Knox Academy fits students for admission to the college or seminary, and furnishes a full English course for such as do not wish to proceed further.

LOMBARD UNIVERSITY.

This institution is under the control of the Universalist denomination and is avowedly non-sectarian in its teachings. It was founded as the Illinois Liberal Institute in 1852, but the plan of instruction was widened and a full collegiate course adopted in 1857, when a charter was obtained under the name of Lombard University, in honor of the generosity of Benjamin Lombard, Sr., who presented the site of the university and other property to the institution. The first class graduated in 1855, and many of the sons and daughters of Lombard have risen to positions of honor and influence.

Lombard is on a solid financial basis, her endowment fund being nearly \$150,000, and continually increasing through the liberality of her friends. The attendance grows larger each year, and the prospects for the future are all her most sanguine friends could desire.

The president, Dr. Nehemiah White, has filled that honorable and responsible position since 1876. He is a ripe scholar, and a man of wide culture, eminently qualified for the office. The college faculty is composed of gentlemen of solid learning and much practical experience, who ably second the efforts of their chief executive.

The courses of study embrace a full collegiate course and a literary course, in which more attention is paid to belles lettres. The divinity school, which was first opened in 1881, has prospered greatly and is firmly established in the affections of the denomination.

The college possesses a valuable library, containing nearly 8,000 volumes, and is well provided with cabinets and chemical apparatus, all of which are free and open to all students. The university grounds have been much improved and there is strong likelihood that additional buildings will adorn the campus ere long.

ST. JOSEPH'S ACADEMY.

This institution was erected in 1879 and is under the supervision of the Sisters of Providence. It is designed to afford the advantages of a high course of academic training to children of Catholic parentage. The course of study is systematic and thorough in the higher English branches, and especial attention is also given to music, painting, and fancy needle-

work. So noted is the excellence of the school in this regard that many ladies attend for instruction in these lines from the good Sisters.

The academy building is a large, commodious structure, in excellent condition without and within, with spacious, well lighted and ventilated study and recitation rooms. The attendance is close upon 300. The girls here, as in the higher classes of the city schools, are in a decided majority. Tuition is given by a faculty consisting of ten Sisters, especially trained and qualified for their work. The academy is well managed in all its departments, and has won general commendation for its excellent educational work in a sphere peculiarly its own.

THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

A celebrated writer has said: "Show me the schools of a city, and I will tell you what its people are." Happily, if this test were applied to our city, we need not fear for the result. The citizen of Galesburg, be he of high or low degree, is proud of their high standing, and lavish in their support. Whatever difference of opinion may exist on other points, in this all are agreed.

From the first school house, built in 1839-40, a rough affair devoid of beauty or convenience, which would hardly pass muster as a cow shed in these days, to the present elaborate school system, is something more than a step, and the comparison serves to point the sharp contrast between then and now. The school system of Galesburg comprises six ward school buildings, a grammar school and a high school. These buildings are all of modern design, of great architectural excellence, and furnished with all apparatus needful to the proper presentation of the instruction sought to be imparted. The course of instruction comprehends eight grades, leading up from the primary to the high school, where a three years' course in the higher English branches and modern languages is provided. The efficient superintendent, Mr. W. L. Steele, has been in charge of the schools since 1885. His management of the important trust reposed in him has proved the wisdom of the choice, and it is no empty praise, but a simple statement of fact, to accord our superintendent a foremost rank among the educators of the state. Nowhere is the spirit of improvement and progress more rife than in educational matters, and in no department of modern life is an alert and cultivated mind more necessary than at the head of such a school system as Galesburg possesses. In the city schools are employed forty teachers. The enrollment in all the schools for 1888 figured 1,987. The attendance in the high school stood 135. The graduating class of 1889 numbered 27.

The total number of graduates since 1863, the first commencement, aggregates 267. It must be borne in mind that only a small proportion of those receiving training in the higher grades persevere to the end, many dropping out to take position in the ranks of the bread-winners, and finding in their school training an effective aid in the struggle.

RAILROADS.

In the sketch of the city preceding this, mention has been made of our superior railroad facilities, and the intimate relation of them to the business, growth, and general prosperity of the city. Foremost among these is the

CHICAGO, BURLINGTON & QUINCY RAILROAD.

December 7th, 1854, will ever be memorable in the annals of Galesburg as the day on which the first train entered the city, and the shrill whistle of the locomotive which startled the echoes on that winter morning heralded the dawning of a new era for Galesburg.

From the fact that public spirited citizens had given much valuable assistance to the road when its construction was still in question, our city has ever been favored by the management, and the great railroad system, now owning and operating over 7,000 miles of road, which has developed from the humble beginning of 1854, has done much to make Galesburg what she is.

Galesburg is the principal transfer and distributing center of the entire system, whence branch lines radiate in every direction, north, south, east and west. Galesburg division proper controls 528 miles of road. Here are located the offices of the superintendent of Illinois lines, Mr. F. C. Rice; the division superintendent, Mr. A. F. Hilton; the general attorney, Illinois lines, Hon. O. F. Price; the division freight agent, R. M. Rogers, Jr.; the division master mechanic, Mr. Robert Colville; Mr. James Hopcraft, manager Western Union Telegraph, and a large force of assistant heads of departments, clerks, etc.

The repair and machine shops and round houses of the company cover a large area, and give employment to a great number of men. Including train men and laborers the payroll comprises over 1,600 names, receiving monthly over \$115,000. It is readily seen that this immense sum, which regularly finds its way through the various channels of trade, has much to do with the prosperity of Galesburg, and should give food for serious reflection to those who are prone to look upon railroads as public enemies and a proper target for unfriendly legislation by city councils and higher legislative bodies.

Recent changes in the running of passenger and freight trains have brought about the transfer to this point as headquarters of a large number of enginemen and train crews, formerly having their terminal point at Aurora and Burlington. This makes a large and welcome addition to our population. The capacity of the stock yards has been much increased during the past three months, nearly doubling the facilities for the prompt handling of stock. The number of cars of stock handled during the year foots up in the thousands, and the feeding and proper care of this vast army of dumb creatures is a task of no small magnitude. Mr. Wilkins Seacord is the superintendent of the stock yards, and under his efficient management everything goes like clockwork.

The C. B. & Q. owns 120 miles of track in Knox county. The value of the property of the company considerably exceeds one million dollars. The returns from local freights show a decided increase from year to year, indicating the constant growth of the city's business.

CHICAGO, SANTA FE & CALIFORNIA RAILWAY.

This road is an extension eastward of the A. T. & S. F. system, now stretching in an unbroken line from Chicago to the Golden Gate. It has been a matter of much self-congratulation to our citizens that Galesburg was fortunate enough to secure its location through her borders. The question, Would it not have come anyway, without the expenditure of \$65,000 good money, will have to go down to posterity unanswered, keeping company with other great problems of the ages. There is no questioning the fact that the road is here, and come to stay, and everybody is mightily glad of it. The grading and filling in of the old Cedar Fork valley—we see clearly now the evidence of benevolent design in that wholly unsightly waterway, disfiguring the central portion of our city; how else could the new road have secured the right of way without an outlay in the purchase of valuable property which would have been prohibitory?—and the erection of the company's depot buildings, have entirely changed the aspect of that part of the city. The new road is a strong one, and its presence is an incalculable benefit to all business and shipping interests. The road bed is ballasted with gravel the entire length, the curves and grades reduced to the least possible departure from a direct line, and no expense in construction spared that would aid in attaining speed with safety. The local freight business of the new line is growing, the feeling among business men being that both roads should receive encouragement.

It is believed that considerable extensions of the company's plant

here will be made ere long, and that before many years the force of circumstances will make Galesburg an important division headquarters for the Santa Fe. Let us neglect no opportunity to convey to the management the intimation that "Barkis is willin'."

THE FULTON COUNTY NARROW GAUGE RAILROAD.

The F. C. N. G. R. R. extends to Havana, Mason county, a distance of 61 miles. Its chief importance to Galesburg is as a fuel provider, opening up to us the bituminous products of the Fulton county mines, and keeping the price of that necessary of life down to a reasonable figure. Some little eastern freight is received over this line, and the way passenger business is quite large. Mr. W. B. Lloyd is the company's representative here, taking the position vacated by Mr. E. T. Maury. He is a pleasant gentleman, and has already made many friends.

COLLEGE CITY STREET RAILWAY.

This line, the pioneer street car line of Galesburg, was organized in 1885, and the construction of upwards of three miles of track completed during the same year. The company now operates nearly six miles of track, and farther extension of its lines through the northern portion of the city is an early probability. The eastern extension, giving cheap and ready access to Lake George Park and Glenwood Park, is largely patronized by pleasure seekers, and is a veritable mine of wealth to the company, while also a much-prized means of inexpensive recreation to the weary toilers of the city.

THE POST OFFICE.

Postmasters come and postmasters go, but the postoffice goes right on just the same. The Democrats are out and the Republicans are in again, which is good or bad news according as one looks at it. The Galesburg postoffice is a growing institution and deserving of more extended notice than our space will admit of. The increase of business from year to year is very considerable, the last financial year showing a gain of nearly 20 per cent. in general revenue, while the money order business shows transactions aggregating more than half a million dollars. The postoffice is located in a room especially prepared for the purpose, furnished with a "Yale" outfit, the recognized standard in postoffice equipments. The postmaster, Francis X. Freer, a true-blue Republican, was appointed by President Harrison in April last, succeeding M. J. Dougherty, Esq., the retiring postmaster. We do not doubt that Mr. Freer will discharge the duties of his responsible office acceptably to the

general public, and are confident that he will be found a worthy successor to the efficient gentlemen who have preceded him in the position.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

THE REPUBLICAN-REGISTER,

(Daily and Weekly,) is published by the Galesburg Printing Company. The compound name indicates the consolidation of two newspapers into one, which was effected in 1872. The *Republican-Register* is the leading newspaper in Knox county, and the most influential organ of the Republican party in the Military Tract. The Daily is the only daily newspaper published here, a quondam competitor, which tried to but couldn't, having gone over to the "silent majority" after a very brief and decidedly inglorious struggle. The Daily *Republican-Register* is a first-class paper in all that much-abused term rightly implies, and a glance at its advertising columns shows both the enterprise of Galesburg merchants and their confidence in its value as an advertising medium. It enjoys a large local circulation, and has besides a considerable circulation in neighboring towns. The Weekly circulates extensively throughout the entire county, every village and hamlet swelling the list. The *Republican-Register* has a valuable corps of correspondents scattered through the county, who gather up and winnow the local happenings of their representative fields, thus keeping all the county informed of the doings of each part. The Weekly is also a valuable advertising medium, reaching the buying class of people in every community, and drawing trade to the metropolis of the county. The job and book department of the Galesburg Printing Co., is noted for the excellence of its productions, and enjoys a liberal patronage. From the beginning the management has been in charge of Mr. S. W. Grubb, and when we assert that Illinois journalism cannot produce a better, it is but simple recognition of his special adaptation for a position requiring much ability and experience. The paper is fortunate in its editorial chief, Mr. Z. Beatty, a veteran journalist, whose political head is level always, and whose education was gotten in a school where time-serving and truckling for personal advantage were not among the branches taught. The city editor, Mr. Fred R. Jelliff, is known as a "hustler," and succeeds admirably in his task of item-gathering for supplying the daily grist of news.

THE PLAINDEALER,

(Weekly) is published by the Plaindealer Printing Co. Mr. Henry Emrich is Business Manager, and Mr. Iram Biggs, Superintendent of

the Job Department. The *Plainsdealer* is an old established newspaper, Republican in politics, and as a party organ stands loyally up for party fealty. It claims the largest circulation of any hebdomadal published in the county, and is accounted a valuable advertising medium. The Business Manager, Mr. Henry Emrich, is one of the old "boys in blue," and in his paper exercises the right to talk as he shot. Mr. Iram Biggs, who manipulates the "talking lead" in the Job Department, is a practical printer of long experience. The City Editor, Mr. R. W. Sweeney, is indefatigable in his quest for news, and the "local" that gets away from him must take to the timber very early in the morning, indeed.

THE PRESS AND PEOPLE.

(Weekly.) enjoys the distinction of being the only representative of Democracy in Knox county. Its editor and proprietor is Mr. Gersh. Martin, one of the best known newspaper men of the state. *The Press and People* is an exponent of Democracy as Mr. Martin understands it, and the wayfaring man, though a fool, need not mistake his exposition of its principles. As a writer, Mr. Martin has few equals in concise and pointed use of language. He is also a close student and keen observer of the varying phases of the social and economic problems which vex our nineteenth century civilization, and like Banquo's ghost, intrude themselves upon our feasts, and will not "down." In this field of thought he has given our "Political Science" club some hard nuts to crack. Being the only Democratic paper in the county the *Press and People* possesses a large circulation.

THE DOLLAR VISITOR.

(Weekly.) is the name of the latest accession to the ranks of Galesburg journalism. The *Visitor* made its first appearance on January 28th, 1899. The publishers are Mr. W. S. Nash and Mr. Ellis Rogers, both young men of ability and good standing in the community. We are pleased to be able to record the fact that, during its brief career thus far, the *Visitor* has been well received, and bids fair to remain a permanent addition, as it is an ornament, to the newspaper field. Mr. W. S. Nash has particular charge of the business management, and keeps an eye to windward for anything likely to give the *Visitor* a lift, while Mr. Rogers attends to the duties of city editor.

RAILROAD BRAKEMEN'S JOURNAL.

(Monthly.) is the organ of the Brotherhood of Railroad Brakemen, published by the Grand Lodge of the Brotherhood, and under the editorial control of Mr. Ed. F. O'Shea, Grand Secretary and Treasurer. Like the

Brotherhood it represents, the *Journal* is full of life and push, and matters of vital importance to this large and, until of late years, much neglected class of railway employes, are discussed and agitated in its columns. A considerable portion of the *Journal* each month is occupied by communications from all parts of the continent—for the Brotherhood has the Western Hemisphere as its territory—and any brother with anything for the "good of the order," is welcome to his say, with only the proviso that "chestnuts with whiskers" are barred out. The ladies, too, marshaled by "Mother Jones," are well represented. In the editorial department Mr. O'Shea holds sway, and in bold, vigorous English—for a spade's a spade with him—knocks the underpinning from humbug, and speaks out for the right of brakemen to a chance for their lives. The *Journal* will keep up the fight on this line until public sentiment and sympathy for these brave men, who carry their lives in their hands every trip they make, shall force and shame the railways into the adoption of safety appliances. The *Journal* now has a circulation of 16,000, and the list is steadily growing. Its pages contain much to interest the general reader, and we cordially recommend it to all.

THE LOMBARD REVIEW.

(Monthly.) is published during the College year by the Lombard Review Joint Stock Co., an association of students of Lombard University. The *Review* has few equals in its especial field, and the excellence of its varied contents speaks well for the training the University affords. A feature in which the *Review* is particularly conspicuous, is that of valuable contributions from students who have gone out from *alma mater*, but still retain their old affection and interest.

THE COUP D'ETAT.

(Monthly.) published during the College year by the Coup d'Etat Publishing Co., an association of students of Knox College. As may well be imagined, it takes considerable of a "Coup" to hold the boys, and it is beyond question one of the best specimens of College journalism in the land.

PUBLIC LIBRARY.

The Galesburg Public Library is a flourishing institution, supported by the city, and free to all citizens, with only the slight restrictions necessary to protect the books and property from abuse and loss. The present Library, with its valuable and extensive collection of books, numbering over 16,000, is the outgrowth of the Young Men's Literary and Library Association, organized in 1860, which owed its existence to the

liberality and public spirit of such citizens as Prof. Albert Hurl, Prof. Comstock, Hon T. J. Hale, Newton Briggs, and others who gave freely from their private libraries and of their time to sustain the enterprise, and afterwards joined in a free gift of the entire collection to the city. The Library is centrally located, and is open every day and evening at stated hours. The Reading Room in connection with the Library is well supplied with the leading daily and weekly newspapers of the world, and also the principal monthly magazines and quarterly reviews. The Directors are appointed by the Mayor at his discretion, and have full control in the purchase of books, and general matters pertaining to the management of the library.

COLVILLE & BRO., Publishers and Book-Binders.

This firm dates its establishment from 1856, the year following the opening of railway communication with Chicago. In the many years that have since come and gone the business of the firm has grown with the city's growth, until at the present time very few establishments outside of the largest cities can compare in extent or facilities for the production of high class work. The firm makes a specialty of Commercial Printing of every description, and fine Book, Catalogue and Magazine work. In these lines this office challenges competition. The *Railroad Bookmen's Journal*, (having a monthly circulation of 16,000) the *Lombard Review* and COLVILLE'S BIENNIAL CITY DIRECTORY, are among their publications. The members of the firm are practical workers, who have grown up in the business, and every job of work, whether great or small, receives equal care and attention, it being their ambition to maintain the reputation of the house for superior workmanship and correct taste. The Bookbindery connected with this establishment is widely known, and does a large business with neighboring towns. Besides magazine and law binding, the manufacture to order of special patterns of blank books and blanks of any style of ruling is here done. In all departments of this extensive business patrons may rely upon prompt attention, first-class work and reasonable prices.

PARKS AND PLEASURE RESORTS.

Within the past few years a "long-felt want"—to borrow a hackneyed phrase—of our otherwise favored city, has been supplied. The grounds known as Highland Park, lying just east of the city, comprise upwards of fifty acres of beautifully wooded country, naturally an attractive spot, with hill and dale and grassy slopes. Art has here enhanced

the charms of nature by artificial lakes of goodly size, well stocked with fish, and affording the pleasure of rowing and fishing to those so inclined. A small menagerie is an endless delight to the younger visitors. More recently, Hon. George W. Brown, an honored citizen, has fitted up the grounds known as Lake George Park, also lying east of the city, as a pleasure resort. An artificial lake of great extent has been formed, through whose placid waters a small but *real* steamer, "Lady Washington," plows its way, to the great delight of children of all ages up to 80—for steamboats are hardly more plentiful hereabout than the proverbially scarce "hen's teeth." A boat house, row boats, landings, kitchen and covered-buildings, and every convenience for comfort and pleasure are here fully provided. The Soangetaha Club has here a handsome building for the use of its members, and its receptions are the social events of the season. Entrance to these pleasure grounds is free to all, only a small charge being made for the use of boats and fishing privileges. Being easy of access by the eastern extension of the College City Street Railway, thousands avail themselves of the opportunity of a few hours' rest and recreation under the green trees and away from the busy streets. It has been suggested that Mr. Brown, than whom no citizen stands higher in the love and veneration of the entire community, could not more fittingly crown his generous deeds, or erect to his memory a more enduring monument after he shall have passed away, than by turning over Lake George Park to the city in trust for its inhabitants for all time. May it be many years ere he shall cease to share in the pleasures he has brought within the reach of the humblest toiler.

COURTS AND COUNTY OFFICERS.

The Knox County Court House is one of the finest in the land, a credit alike to city and county. It is built in the most substantial manner, and will long remain as a testimony to the sound sense and wise liberality of the generation which builded it. The Court House occupies the block formerly the east half of the City Park, facing east on Cherry and north on Tompkins streets, and contains the offices of all the County officials, County and Circuit Court rooms, Jury rooms, etc.

Knox County is a part of the Tenth Judicial District of Illinois, the Judges being Hon. Arthur A. Smith, of Galesburg, Hon. John J. Glenn, of Monmouth, and Hon. Geo. W. Pleasants, of Rock Island. The terms are held the first Monday in February and June, and the third Monday

in October. James J. Tunnickliff, State's Attorney; Josiah Gale, Circuit Clerk and Recorder; James B. Boggs, Master in Chancery.

BROTHERHOOD OF RAILROAD BRAKEMEN.

This organization, although less than six years have passed since its first humble beginning in the village of Oneonta, New York, is to-day one of the strongest among the fraternal associations of railway employes. This is emphatically the age of co-operation. Now as never before in the world's history is the old fable understood which, through the medium of a handful of twigs, that separately are easily snapped, but when joined in one compact bundle, cannot be broken, teaches the lesson that in union is strength. A simple lesson, truly, yet the workman has been many hundreds of years in learning it!

There is a positive fascination in tracing the rise and progress of such an organization as the Brotherhood of Railroad Brakemen, and its phenomenal success is surely a prophecy of the rapid approach of that "good time coming."

"When man to man, the world o'er,
Shall brothers be, and a' that."

There is yet much to be done, however, before that blissful day dawneth; capital yet requires some education as to the rights of labor, and corporations, which are said to possess no souls, must be taught a decent regard for the bodies of those who are obliged to risk life and limb in their service. The B. of R. B. proposes to officiate as schoolmaster, in so far as the rights and wrongs of brakemen are concerned, and has been

already largely instrumental in correcting many abuses, of which in the past the brakeman, without influence and without friends, was too often the helpless victim.

The Order has for its aim and object the union of all railroad brakemen of good character; the promotion of their interests, social, moral and intellectual; the protection of themselves and their families by the exercise of a systematic benevolence; and to encourage and promote mutual confidence and assist in the maintaining of harmonious relations between its members and their employers.

When the little handful of brakemen met and banded together in September, 1889, they little thought they were planting the seed of a tree whose growth would challenge the admiration of a continent, and whose fruits were to carry consolation and healing into thousands of homes. Let us glance briefly at some of the results already achieved:

During its existence of less than six years, this organization has paid out in claims to the families of dead and totally disabled members (unlike ordinary insurance companies, total disability, debarring the victim from following his avocation, is compensated for the same as in case of death), the sum of \$500,000. For the five months ending May 31, 1889, claims for deaths and total disability were paid, aggregating \$146,918. The amount paid to the family of a member in case of death or total disability is \$1,000. The cost, when the hazard of the calling is taken into account, is very moderate, averaging about \$2.00 monthly. When it is borne in mind that ordinary life insurance companies virtually bar their doors against the brakeman by the imposition of a prohibitory tariff, both the great dangers he must face in the daily discharge of his duty and the beneficence of this order are better understood and appreciated.

The organization now numbers 310 lodges in good standing, with a membership of 15,000, and is rapidly increasing. The motto "Benevolence, Sobriety and Industry," indicates the cardinal principles of the Brotherhood; intemperance or immoral conduct is not tolerated; a fraternal sentiment is inculcated, and members are taught to regard the lodge room as a place for companionship and social and intellectual intercourse.

The Brotherhood stands firmly for its rights, but seeks to gain them peacefully; by conciliation, rather than aggression. Strikes are looked upon as only a last resort, the Order favoring arbitration as a manner of settling disputes or misunderstandings. Religion, politics, nor any-

thing save solely and exclusively the good of the Order has place or influence in shaping the policy of the organization.

The general offices of the Brotherhood are located in an elegant suite of rooms over the First National Bank. Here the Grand Secretary and Treasurer, Mr. Ed. F. O'Shea, has charge of the vast business of the organization, with its correspondence pouring in by the bushel, and many perplexing questions pressing for immediate settlement. This brother has a real grievance, which must be looked into and set right; another is simply a "Kicker" from force of habit or bad digestion—he must be gently but firmly sat down upon; yet another is a fraud—there are black sheep, alas, in every flock!—and on him the vials of wrath are sure to be uncorked, and woe betide the luckless wretch who ventures on such a game with Mr. O'Shea! The burden and responsibility of all this must indeed be great, but everything moves like a perfect piece of machinery; no jars, no friction. Mr. O'Shea is also Editor and Manager of the *Railroad Brakemen's Journal*, the official organ of the Brotherhood, published monthly, with a present circulation of 16,000, reaching every part of the United States and Canada where railroads penetrate, and in this position has displayed equal executive ability. The *Journal* is a fearless advocate of the rights of brakemen, and is urgent and persistent in its demand for the adoption by railroads of safety appliances to lessen the frightful slaughter of brakemen, of which at least 75 per cent., it is claimed, might be prevented, but for the cupidity or callous-heartedness which refuses to listen to the appeal. The agitation, set on foot and kept up by the *Journal*, is gaining force, and the public, once aroused, will join with the Brotherhood in the demand, and compel obedience.

The Grand Master, S. E. Wilkinson, and three Vice Grand Masters, have their headquarters here, but their time is chiefly spent in visiting and instructing lodges, and organizing new lodges, investigating and adjusting grievances, etc. Upon the Grand Secretary and Treasurer devolves the general management. The prosperity of the Order and its rapid rise to the front rank of fraternal organizations, tell of arduous labors well performed. As assistants in the general offices of the Order are employed Messrs. W. A. Sheahan, chief clerk; Jas. K. Fitzgerald, J. C. O'Shea and R. J. Powers, all worthy citizens and estimable gentlemen.

THE COVENANT MUTUAL BENEFIT ASSOCIATION.

This association has done much toward making Galesburg a household word even from ocean unto ocean. It began twelve years ago,

without a member, with no reputation, and with the insurance field already well occupied by companies which were then considered successful. By the superior ability, zeal, and desire for fair dealing of its originators, the C. M. B. A. has been made one of the best insurance associations in the country. Should it never issue another certificate the name of Galesburg would be sung for at least two generations by those benefited through its instrumentality. Already it has between 30,000 and 35,000 individual members, residing in different states and territories, who are making regular bi-monthly remittances into our city. All of this is not without a meaning. In the first place, it compels men everywhere to admit that a city which has within itself an institution capable of paying out, in death claims, an average of \$30,000 a month, must be made up of men of energy, enterprise and ability. Again, a portion of the money that is collected is used here, which adds to the material welfare of Galesburg. It pays salaries to between twenty-five and thirty people who work in the office, all of whom are citizens. Nearly, if not all of this money is put into circulation through our merchants, grocers, etc.

The association pays rent upon a large suite of rooms, which have been fitted up under the immediate direction of its general manager, admitted by insurance men who have traveled extensively, to be the finest offices in this country occupied by any assessment insurance company. Many thousand dollars are paid to local printing establishments every year for work and stationery. Through its agency the grade of our postoffice has been raised so that its money order department stands second in the state. In the single year of 1888, the C. M. B. A. paid for postage stamps and cards \$6,751.89. It publishes a paper known as the *Covenant Quarterly*, which has a circulation of 35,000. It is an eight page paper "published in the interest of assessment life insurance." This gigantic institution, with nearly \$85,000,000 at risk, has done and is doing much toward making Galesburg the Hartford of the West, so far as a reputation as an insurance center is concerned. We must not allow ourselves to think that these results have been attained without effort. It must not be forgotten that he who was at the head of the enterprise at its inception, has from the beginning been its secretary and general manager, planning, guiding, and working hard for the past twelve years, much of the time far into the night, building up an institution in our midst of which every citizen has a just right to be proud, one that honors Galesburg, spreads her name, brings material wealth within her borders, and

has placed our respected citizen, E. F. Phelps, where he justly belongs, in the front rank of insurance men of our country.

MUTUAL LOAN & BUILDING ASSOCIATION.

This association was organized in November, 1887, and in the few months of its existence has achieved a most remarkable success. These loan and building associations are not an untried experiment whose outcome is yet doubtful. To the contrary, a long and uniformly successful experience in many of the oldest and wealthiest cities of the United States has demonstrated that this plan combines the advantages of the savings bank with the additional and very decided benefit arising from the fact that in the building association the member is both a depositor and stockholder, with an equal voice in the management of its affairs, and an equal participation in the profits. As has been said, these associations have been uniformly successful, when properly conducted, and have been the means of securing thousands of homes to workingmen, and the large class dependent upon a small salary for the means of subsistence. The general plan of all these associations is much the same, the rigid test of time having shown the weak spots in the system as adopted by the pioneer companies, and enabled those later in the field to profit by their experience. In matters of detail individual associations differ: some bearing more heavily upon the borrowing shareholder, to the enhanced profit of the shareholders who invest with a view to securing a higher rate of interest than the open market offers. The Mutual Loan and Building Association has several points of excellence that especially recommend it to popular favor, and furnish a ready explanation of the success already achieved. The money received from monthly dues is offered for loans at the regular meetings. Members are not encouraged to bid against each other, running the premium up to an exorbitant rate, but are advised to keep within reasonable bounds. When the loan is made the interest is paid monthly; no interest is taken in advance. Thus a borrower wanting \$1,000 is not obliged to borrow \$1,100 in order to get it. Should he desire to repay a loan, or any part of it at any time before the maturity of the same, he is allowed all the profit which has been earned by the stock loaned upon, up to the date of repayment. These special features of this association are particularly in the interest of workingmen and people of small means desiring to secure homes by easy payments. In adopting and adhering to them the association fulfills the true intent of such organizations, and richly deserves its success. From its third semi-annual statement we take a few figures

showing progress already made. During the eighteen months of its existence the M. L. & B. A. has made thirty-one loans, aggregating \$22,200. The number of shares in force is 1,762, and the membership nearly 300. The valuation of stock shows for Series 1, issued December, 1887, amount paid on each share \$9, profits accrued \$1.24, present value each share \$10.24. This is a gain of over 18 per cent. per annum, and speaks well indeed for the careful management of the affairs of the association.

It is to the officers of an association of this kind that one looks in determining its title to the confidence and support of the public, and it would be difficult indeed to find any more worthy of trust. The officers are, Geo. A. Murdoch, President; F. H. Rearick, Vice President; James L. Burkhalter, Treasurer; H. W. Carpenter, Secretary; Jay L. Hastings, Attorney. In the Board of Directors, in addition to the above, are S. J. Parry, R. C. Haines, Hiram Mars, Robert Colville, M. O. Williamson.

SCANDINAVIAN MUTUAL AID ASSOCIATION.

This association was incorporated under the laws of Illinois September 12th, 1883, and began in business on October 26th, following. It was organized for the purpose of affording to our Swedish-American citizens the benefits of life insurance upon the assessment plan, in a company organized, officered and controlled by their own fellow-countrymen, and therefore managed in their especial interest. That the association has fully realized the expectations of its promoters and attained a firm hold upon the confidence of that large class of our fellow-citizens to which it particularly looks for support, these figures attest: The membership on June 1st, 1889, was 5,500; the total amount of insurance in force, \$8,000,000. Since the date of organization, in October, 1883, the association has paid to beneficiaries of deceased members \$165,000. The average cost of insurance since organization has been \$7.00 per \$1,000 for persons under forty years of age.

All claims arising from death are paid in full, according to amount written in certificate of membership, and members have the additional security of a reserve fund, now amounting to \$15,000, and increasing steadily, every assessment contributing to swell the amount.

The offices of the association are located over the Galesburg National Bank. The officers and board of directors are the following named gentlemen, who have served in their respective positions since the organization of the association: President, S. P. A. Lindahl; Vice President, N. J. Oleen; Secretary, Nels Nelson; Treasurer, Jonas A. Johnson; Medical

Directors, Dr. J. T. Wilson; Directors, S. P. A. Lindahl, C. G. Tholin, Muller, G. A. Bolman, Chicago; John A. Oberg, N. J. Oleen, Jonas A. Johnson, Charles A. Peterson, Nels Nelson, N. O. G. Johnson. The high standing in the community of these gentlemen is sufficient guarantee, if any were required, that the affairs of the association will be managed with the most scrupulous fidelity, and that constant effort will be made in the direction of the highest security to the insured at the minimum of cost. How well this has been thus far accomplished the figures already given bear witness, and under the same prudent and conservative management, which aims at healthy growth rather than rapid increase by the admission of doubtful risks, a long and prosperous career of beneficence is assured. To Mr. Nels Nelson, who was largely instrumental in organizing the association, and who has since served it in the capacity of secretary, is due much of the credit of bringing the S. M. A. A. to its present solid and substantial position. He is a gentleman who has grown up from boyhood in our midst and has always inherited and held the fullest confidence of all classes in the community. He has served his fellow citizens in various elective offices of responsibility and trust, ever performing well the duties devolved upon him. That the S. M. A. A. will flourish while under his care, is an assured fact.

COLLEGE CITY GUARDS.

The College City Guards, forming Company C, 6th Regt. I. N. G., was organized and mustered into the State Militia on the 27th of September, 1878. The company now numbers 50, made up from only the best class of young men, is fully uniformed and armed with the latest improved rifles, and has attained a high state of efficiency in drill and discipline. The company was called into active service, during the strike on the Gould system at East St. Louis, some months since, and made a good record for soldierly behavior. Regular drill is held every Monday night at Armory hall, 45 South Prairie St. Monthly inspection and dress parade on first Monday of each month. The officers are: Captain, Chas. E. Fitch; First Lieutenant, Frank L. Andrews.

THE GALESBURG CLUB.

This is an organization whose membership is made up largely from among the leading business and professional men of our city. It has elegant club rooms, located at Nos. 20 to 24 South Prairie St. These are fitted up handsomely with everything conducive to comfort and enjoyment, and at stated intervals receptions are held, to which the beauty and fashion of the city have set the seal of approval. This however, is but a primary object, as set forth in the constitution, is "to promote the business interests of the city of Galesburg." This is a most praiseworthy object, and all citizens will heartily join in the fervent hope that our Galesburg Club will always be able to bring down the persimmons.

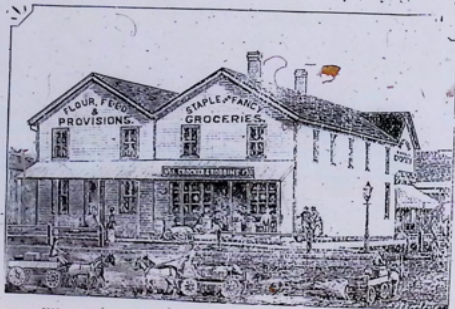

In the same manner, all Streets intersecting Broad Street take the prefix WEST on all Street Signs West of Broad, but have no prefix East of that Street. In this Directory, however, the prefixes EAST, WEST, NORTH and SOUTH have been used to prevent possible misapprehension. The numbering of the Streets begins at the base line on Broad or Main Street, and each Block is assigned 100 Numbers, the second Block running from 100 to 200, the third to 300, and so on. By this plan, the number of a House being given, it is easy to calculate its distance from the dividing line in either direction.
