INTRODUCTORY.

In presenting this Work to the Public the compiler deems it necessary to make a few explanatory remarks. Probably there is no department of book-making in which errors are more likely to be made than in the compilation of a Directory. The constant change and new arrivals in our Western Cities, together with the total ignorance which many of our citizens are under of the name of even the street they live in, combine to make the work far more difficult and troublesome than most people imagine, nevertheless the compiler having done the whole of the Canvas himself he can with confidence assure his friends and patrons that he has taken the greatest pains and used his utmost exertions to make the work accurate and complete.

It would make a Directory far more valuable were the names of the streets posted and the houses numbered, and as there appears to be a general desire for this to be done it is hoped the Council of the different cities will take the matter in hand.

The compiler takes this opportunity of acknowledging the assistance which has been given him by Profs. Grant and Standish, Mr. C. J. Sellon, and Mr. R. Colville, of Galesburg, Mr. Swain and Prest. Wallace of Monmouth, Mr. J. Winters of Knoxville, and Mr. O. White of Abingdon. His thanks are also due to those who have favored him with their advertisements, and he trusts they will be pleased with the manner in which they are displayed.

In conclusion, the book is thrown upon a generous public with the hopes that whatever imperfections it may have will be kindly overlooked and that it may meet with the satisfactory reception which the compiler has labored to achieve.

GALESBURG.

Galesburg, the name of which is derived from its principal founder, Rev. Geo. W. Gale, is the largest City in Knox county, situated upon a rich and rolling prairie, and bordered on the north side by Henderson Grove, which covers an area of 40 or 50 miles. This city was laid out in the year 1836, by a party of New Englanders, of whom Rev. Geo. W. Gale was the head, their main object being to build up a City whose character should diffuse the influence of Religion and Education over an important region of the country. From that period to the present time the City has progressed rapidly, both in character and extent, having obtained a City charter this present year, (1857). The population at the present time is about 6,000. Two fine Colleges have been built, both of which are in a prosperous condition; also, Public and Private Schools, seven Churches, and several useful and instructive institutions, full description of which will be found in the following pages.* It also supports a good Daily Paper, and other literary productions. A spirit of more than usual energy and enterprise is displayed in the character of the merchants, while those who have accumulated wealth are employing their surplus means in the improvement of their property. New and substantial buildings are taking the place of those no longer sufficient for the increased amount of business, and handsome residences are springing up on every side. Thus the City is becoming every day more and more important, not only in its commercial aspect but from its position as being the centre of an educational and religious movement, knowledge is diffused, and sound moral principles inculcated all through the surrounding country.

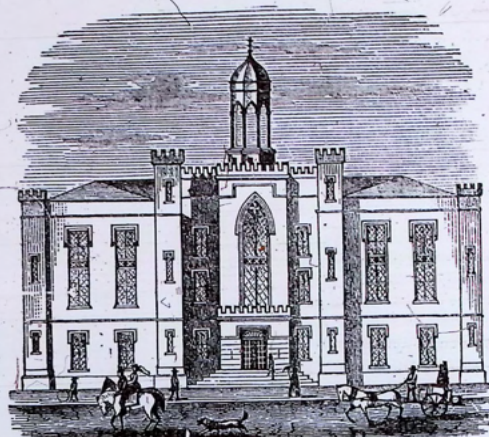

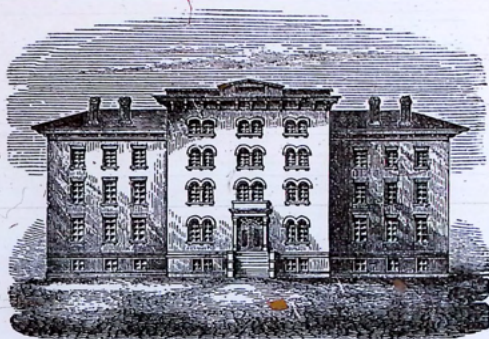

FEMALE SEMINARY.

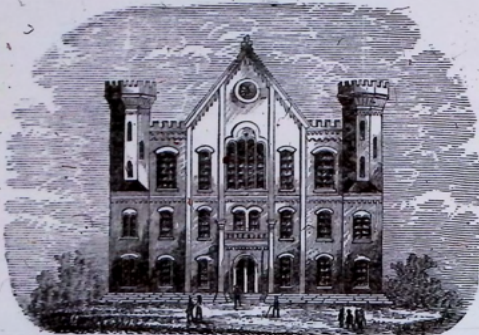
The building for the Female Seminary, in connection with Knox College, is also drawing towards its completion, and when finished will form one of the greatest ornaments of the city.

SOCIETIES.

The *Adelphi Society of Knox College* was incorporated by an Act of Legislature, approved Feb. 25, 1847, and under its charter can accumulate an amount not exceeding \$25,000 in property of any description. It contains a library of nearly 500 volumes.

The *Gnothautii Society of Knox College* has for its object the development of intellectual and moral strength and the cultivation of executive and administrative talent. To this end important questions are discussed in the Society's Hall every week, essays read, and occasional public performances. It holds its anniversaries on the first Tuesday of every November. The Society has a library fund which is at present sufficient to purchase about 800 volumes.

The *Adelphi Society of Lombard University*.—This is a Literary Society, composed of, and conducted by, Students of Lombard University. It was organized in November, 1855, and its meetings have since been held at the University on Saturday evening of each week. The exercises consist of discussions upon miscellaneous topics, reading of a Magazine, edited and sustained by the ladies of the Society, and general business appertaining to the Society.

It is designed to be a permanent organization connected with the Institution, and to afford the Students an opportunity for improvement in those things not embraced in the regular course of instruction.

The *Auto-Keluthii Society of Lombard University*.—The Society of the Auto-Keluthii was established September 9th, 1854, by the students of the Collegiate Department of "Illinois Liberal Institute," since "Lombard University," having for its object the acquirement of knowledge, the procurement of skill and confidence in debate, and facility in the communication of thought.

Measures are now being taken to incorporate it by charter; a new hall and library rooms are in an active state of preparation, and the future bids fair to attend its efforts with success.

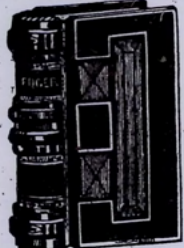

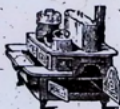

Preparatory Department.—English, Latin, and Greek Grammars; Latin and Greek Readers; New Testament; Cæsar, Sallust, and Virgil; Arithmetic and Algebra, (commenced;) Geography—Ancient and Modern; Elocution and Vocal Music.

Freshman Class.—Cicero's Orations and Livy; Xenophon's Anabasis and Herodotus; Algebra (completed) and Geometry; Roman Antiquities and History.

Sophomore Class.—Horace and Cicero De Officiis; Thucydides and Homer's Iliad; Plane and Spherical Trigonometry; Surveying, Mensuration and Topography; Greek Antiquities and History.

Junior Class.—Tacitus and Roman Literature; Demosthenes; De Corona and Aeschylus; Hebrew; Analytical Geometry and Calculus; Natural Philosophy; Mental Philosophy; Natural Theology and Evidences of Christianity; Rhetoric and Logic.

Senior Class.—Cicero de Oratore; Plato Contra Atheos and Greek Literature; Hebrew; Calculus; Astronomy; Chemistry; Physiology, Geology, and Botany; Butler's Analogy, Ethics, Story on the Constitution; Political Economy, and Hodges' Way of Life.

The Greek Testament will be read, and exercises in Composition and Declamation required throughout the course.

The preceding subjects, exclusive of the Ancient Languages, constitute a partial course, which may be completed in three years.

Bullion's Grammars and Classics; Ray's Arithmetic and Davies' series of Mathematical Works are used as Text Books.

A valuable Library has been procured, containing about 1000 volumes, including about \$500 worth of new books, carefully selected. The apparatus, just purchased, affords the means of illustrating all the doctrines of Astronomy, Natural Philosophy and Chemistry. It is designed to make the advantages to be enjoyed in this department equal to those of any other Western Institution.

The College year is divided into three sessions. The first begins the first Monday of September, and ends the Friday before Christmas. The second begins the first Monday after New Year's Day, and ends the Friday before the first day of April. The third begins one week after the following Monday, and ends the last Thursday of June.

Tuition is \$20 and \$30 per annum. Boarding costs from \$1.75 to \$2.50 per week in respectable private families. Some students board themselves at a cost of less than one dollar a week. Male and Female pupils are admitted on the same terms.

A commodious College Building is nearly completed, and already occupied. A plan of Endowment by the Sale of Scholarships has been adopted, which will afford tuition on the most reasonable terms, and at the same time, it is believed, create a permanent fund, amply sufficient to sustain the Institution. For more particular information in relation to the nature of this scheme, or any other matters connected with the College, inquirers may address any member of the Faculty, or any officer of the Board.

This Institution was founded with the view of furnishing the most complete intellectual training, under the most healthy moral and religious influences; and no efforts will be spared to secure completely the object intended.

KNOXVILLE.

THE CITY OF KNOXVILLE, the County seat of Knox County, Illinois, is located on the south-west quarter of section twenty-eight, in township eleven, north of range two, east of the fourth principal meridian—which tract was purchased by the County Commissioners at the Land Office in Springfield, under the provision of an act of Congress allowing to Counties the right of pre-emption to a quarter section of land for the location of County seats. In the session of the Legislature of this State of 1830-31, an act was passed locating the County seat, which was then called Henderson. In 1831, the town was laid out and surveyed by P. Owen, Esq., County Surveyor, and the first sale of lots made. The town was incorporated several years ago, and in the session of the Legislature of 1852-53, a City Charter was granted under which its municipal affairs are now regulated. There have been several additions and sub-divisions added to the original town plat, and the present City Charter includes nine quarter sections of which the original town is the center tract.

The City at present is estimated to contain about 2,500 inhabitants, and is rapidly improving both in population and wealth.

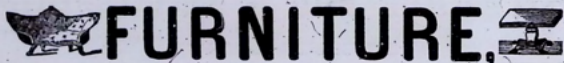
