
# **January Reading Challenge**

The library is currently accepting donations for the Blessing Box located on Broad Street. A Blessing Box is a place to donate goods for others in need to pick up anonymously. There are several boxes located throughout Galesburg, all of which take donations from the community and are available free to anyone. We will be accepting donations at the front desk inside the library through December 29. Suggested donations include: shelf-safe dry goods, individually wrapped snacks, toiletries, dry pet food, hats, gloves, scarves, and socks.

## **Friends of the Library News**

The Friends of the Galesburg Public Library are taking a break over the holidays and will resume activities in 2023. No donations are being accepted at this time. We thank all who contributed to the October book sale, which raised \$1,978.51. All funds are used to support the library, and at the November 2 meeting the Friends voted unanimously to use \$10,000 of the funds for a bird-safe window in the new library.
