Biographical Note	The Galesburg State Research Hospital was built in 1943, originally for wounded and ill soldiers returning from World War Two. Doctor Harold Himwich developed the drug Chlorpromazine at the hospital in 1955. The hospital was turned over to the state of Illinois in 1946, and to the Department of Public Welfare in 1950. The hospital closed in 1985 and many of the buildings remain, owned by private businesses.
Scope & Content	The Galesburg State Research Hospital collection includes photos of professors and doctors from the years 1866-1965.
