A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR ON REOPENING PLANS

As I write this, restaurants have just begun to welcome diners back indoors, Galesburg schools are preparing to reopen, and our county's Covid positivity rates are gradually decreasing. We are hopeful that our community may be beginning to heal, but we are also cautious, trusting the experts who advise us to maintain social distancing and mask-wearing practices. With that caution, we are working on a plan to reopen our doors and welcome our community back into the building. In the next few weeks, we hope to schedule appointments for in-person library visits, offering the full breadth of our services including public computer use; faxing, copying, and scanning services; notary services; and materials browsing. To keep you and our staff safe, we will observe the 25% capacity guidelines set for gatherings, masks will be worn at all times, and social distancing will be practiced. Events and programs will continue virtually or via our take-and-make programs, curbside checkout will continue, and wi-fi will be accessible outside of our building for anyone who needs it. We look forward to seeing your masked faces again and will do our best to provide you with exception service, from a distance.

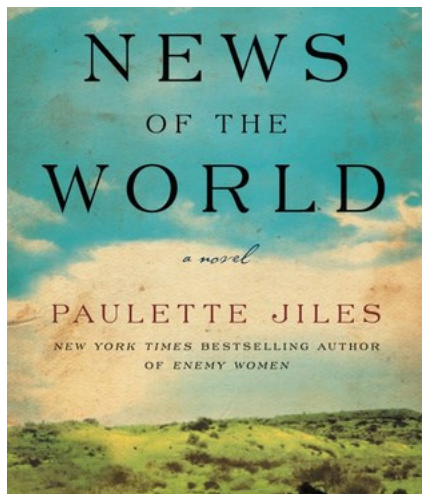

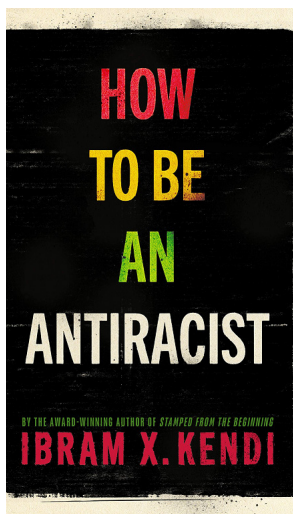
Tome Raiders Sci-Fi/Fantasy Book Club

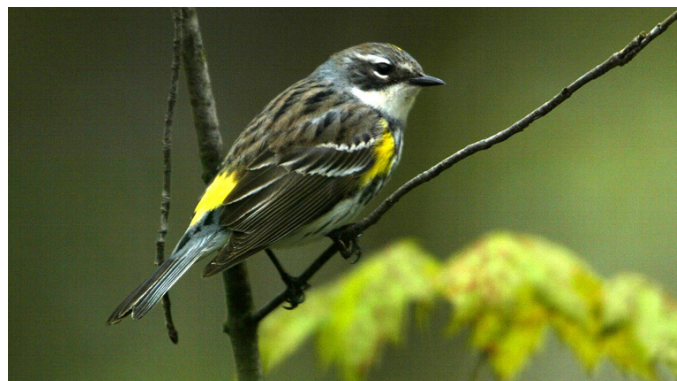
Big Write

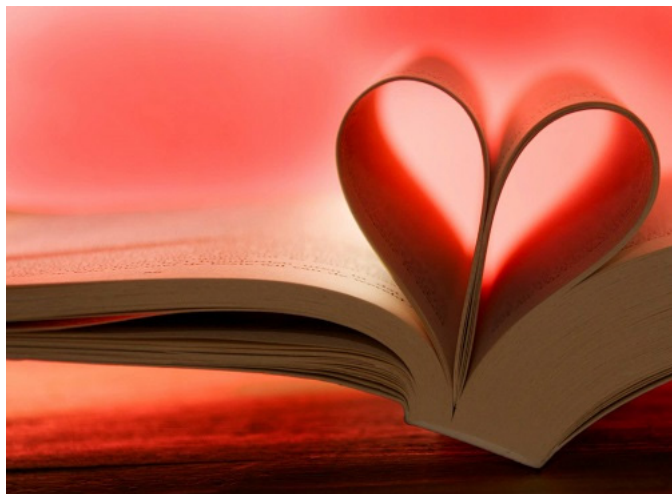

LOCAL HISTORY

Many people have written, called, or emailed the library in the last year asking where they can find genealogy and local history information when they can't visit the library. While in-person research is difficult right now (not just at GPL, but at many institutions), it's still possible to find some information online. Here are a few places to start your research until you can visit the library again:

Ancestry Library Edition

Ancestry.com is home to millions of documents, photographs, and other materials that can be helpful to a genealogical search — or even just fun to browse. Ordinarily, the library edition is only available inside the building, but we've temporarily expanded the service to any GPL cardholder. Simply log in to your RSA account here: https://alsi.sdp.sirsi.net/client/en_US/GalesburgPL/ to gain access.

Sandburg.org

The website for the Carl Sandburg Historic Site Association isn't just for information about Carl Sandburg and his birthplace. There are also photos, videos, and other information about the city and its history. Local historian Barbara Schock has written hundreds of articles for the "Sandburg's Hometown" series that cover everything from the Post Office to baking bread to the town's founders and their families.

GPL's Digital Image Archive
